## **Glossary of Suggested Accessibility Settings**

Making the text on a user's screen bigger can greatly benefit users with vision difficulty. This will scale text in all of the device's programs.



Using the magnifier tool will allow users to easily enlarge parts of their screen to make them easier to read.



O Blue-yellow (tritanopia)

Windows 10 has built-in colorblind filters to assist users who suffer from color blindness.

Control your mouse with a keypad
Turn on Mouse Keys to use the numeric keypad to move the mouse pointer

If a user struggles with using a mouse, they can enable mouse control via the keyboard. With this setting on, a user can enjoy all the functions of a mouse on their keyboard.

Use your device without a physical keyboard	
Use the On-Screen Keyboard Off	
Press the Windows logo key 🖏 + Ctrl + O to turn the On-Screen Keyboard on or off.	

If a user struggles with using a keyboard, they can enable an on-screen keyboard that can be controlled by clicking or touch controls if applicable.



Vision difficulty can lead to trouble finding your mouse pointer on screen. Users can customize the appearance of the mouse pointer for ease of use.

Use high contrast
Turn on high contrast

Press left Alt + left Shift + Print Screen to turn high contrast on and off.

Turning on high contrast will increase the differences between the light and dark colors on-screen. This can be used if a user is colorblind or struggle with readability.

Dictate text and control your device using only your voice
Turn on Speech Recognition Off

Windows allows users to completely control their device with their voice. This allows users to use voice commands to navigate their computer and the web.

#### Narrator

Narrator is a screen reader that describes what's on your screen so you can use that information to navigate your device. It can be controlled by keyboard, touch, and mouse.

Use Narrator

Turn on Narrator Off

Narrator will describe what is on a user's screen. Once enabled, a voice will read out content on screen and continue to do so until disabled.
