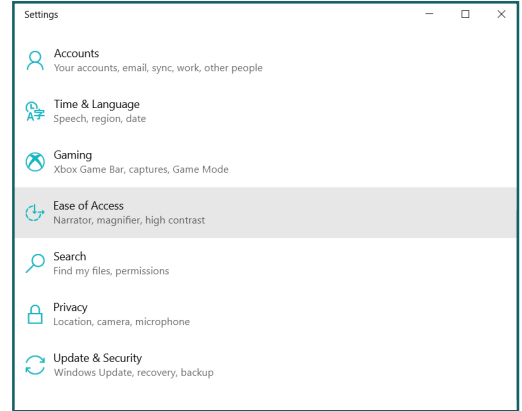
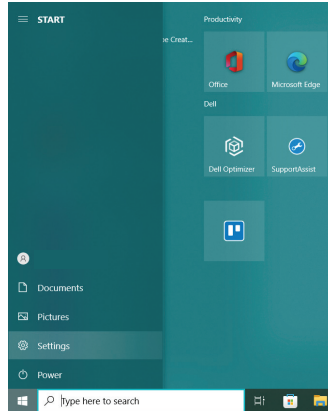


1. To access the Windows 10 accessibility option, click on the Windows icon or press the Windows key (⊞) to open the start menu.

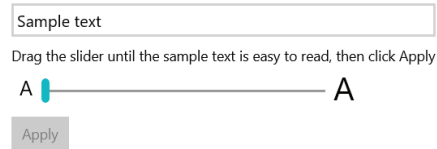

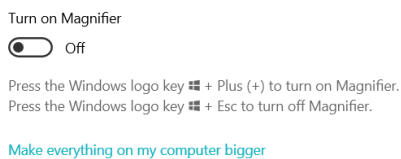
Glossary of Suggested Accessibility Settings

Make text bigger



Making the text on a user's screen bigger can greatly benefit users with vision difficulty. This will scale text in all of the device's programs.

Use Magnifier



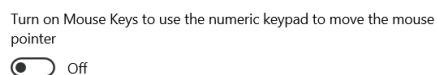
Using the magnifier tool will allow users to easily enlarge parts of their screen to make them easier to read.

Or select a colorblindness filter to make the nine colors on the wheel more distinct.

- Red-green** (green weak, deuteranopia)
- Red-green** (red weak, protanopia)
- Blue-yellow** (tritanopia)

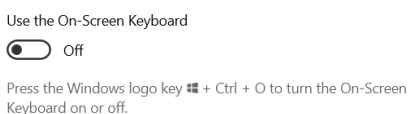
Windows 10 has built-in colorblind filters to assist users who suffer from color blindness.

Control your mouse with a keypad



If a user struggles with using a mouse, they can enable mouse control via the keyboard. With this setting on, a user can enjoy all the functions of a mouse on their keyboard.

Use your device without a physical keyboard



If a user struggles with using a keyboard, they can enable an on-screen keyboard that can be controlled by clicking or touch controls if applicable.

Change pointer size and color



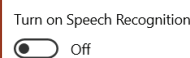
Vision difficulty can lead to trouble finding your mouse pointer on screen. Users can customize the appearance of the mouse pointer for ease of use.

Use high contrast



Turning on high contrast will increase the differences between the light and dark colors on-screen. This can be used if a user is colorblind or struggle with readability.

Dictate text and control your device using only your voice



Windows allows users to completely control their device with their voice. This allows users to use voice commands to navigate their computer and the web.

Use Narrator



Narrator will describe what is on a user's screen. Once enabled, a voice will read out content on screen and continue to do so until disabled.
