

Transcript for March on Washington:

Voice of Joseph McDomick, Jr, Civil Rights Movement Activist: Yes, part of the March on Washington was planned in the Center.

Voice of Interviewer:

Let's talk a little bit about this.

Voice of Joseph McDomick, Jr.:

Absolutely. Let me just..the.. Frank Richard, he had his close knit circle of folks. His lieutenants. You know, Abernathy, Lowery, and Andrew Young, Jose Williams, Walter Fontroy, all of those guys... John Lewis. Those guys were some of the, what we called the lieutenants. They all would get together and do a lot of the planning and strategizing. Then they would branch out to the smaller groups to talk about what the plan was.

So the small knit group planned the march and they would say to the branches, "Look, this is what our plans are. This is what you need to do. This is where we are going to be. We want you to show up in forces."

That is the way they planned it, so that group of, that small knit group, did most of the planning. That small group would bring it to the larger group and talk about the plan.
